The senior 1s will play premier grade rugby for the Hardham Cup in the second round following an outstanding run to secure the Harper Lock Shield.

The unbeaten Dave McGuinness and John Duignan-coached side racked up 465 points in its 11 games, and conceded just 96.

Halfback Sean Hay and prop Sean Coburn have captained the team, and are among the many players who regularly back up the premiers.

Eleven teams performing well

Marist St Pats' 2009 season is well underway. This year we are fielding 11 teams (comprising 335 players), but several are bursting at the seams.

This compares with 13 in the senior club five years ago in 2004; MSP continues to be one of the largest clubs in the Wellington Union. But members should not take the club's strength for granted. It takes a dedicated group of volunteers to achieve such a strong position.

Congratulations to the club's senior teams who have started the season so successfully. The premiers, coached by Kevin Horan and Murray Tocker, have a lot of depth; the senior 1s, coached by Dave McGuinness and John Duignan, have already marched off with the Harper Lock Shield.

The senior 2s, with coaches Gus

Slade and John Pouterewa, and the 3rds with coaches Sione Savi'inaea and Sio Mapu, have all performed well, while the under-21s coached by Dave Wanden and Steve McGill were runners-up in their grade.

The 80/80 Blues coached by Andrew Robinson, and the reserve grade MSP Internationals with coaches Edwin Meachen and Cameron Bath, were first-round winners of their grades.

Obviously winning enhances the enjoyment everyone gets from being involved with MSP and with individual teams, but it also promotes camaraderie among players and supporters at the clubrooms.

Already Richie Renouf and Mere Wilson have planned a successful Old Timers Day and an MSP Idol night (congratulations to Adam Saxton of the 80/80 Blues team), and there are more theme nights to come. A special memory was the reunion of the 1949 St Patrick's

College Old Boys Jubilee Cupwinning team!

Being part of the Marist St Pats family means being part of a team. And in this regard the management committee was pleased to nominate MSP members for the various categories of *The Dominion Post* Sportsperson of the Year Awards - the nominations are listed on the next page.


Players appreciate this support and other clubs recognise it as another strength of the Red Machine.

Tino remembered

The sudden passing of Tino Fidow, 70, in February saddened many club members who remember Tino from his many years playing for MSP.

He was working as a security guard at Parliament at the time of his passing, and his well attended funeral was a tribute to his popularity.

Now he will be remembered in future clashes between the presidents sides of MSP and Petone, who will play to decide the holder of the Tino Fidow Cup.

The club's 25th Jubilee book has a photo of grey-haired Tino playing for the presidents - it's captioned "an outstanding player over 25 years", and that was in 1996.

It was as a pressies prop that he reputedly scored his first try - in 1992, after many years as a senior player.

His brother Andrew is a Petone



stalwart, and the trophy is a fitting way to acknowledge a popular and loval club member.

Premier centurions

Two MSP players achieved rare milestones in club rugby this season when they recorded their 100th premier games for the club.

Prop Jamie Parkinson led the team onto the field for his 100th, a 55-3

win over Tawa on 11 April.

Then outside back Jon Paul Tocker hit the century on 23 May in the premiers 59-0 defeat of Avalon. JP, who made his premier debut against Old Boys Uni in 2002,

Haere Ra Charles Mareikura

St Pats Old Boys Cup winners

These members of the 1949 St Pats Old Boys senior side were the second team in Marist St Pats to win a Jubilee Cup. The Marist club had first won the trophy in 1948, the St Pats team above shared it with Petone a year later, and Marist went on to win it again in 1950. Marist and SPOB later merged in 1971.

Sixty years after their 1949 victory, members of the SPOB team gathered at the clubrooms on Old Timers' Day, 4 May 2009, to celebrate the occasion.

Something of the intense flavour of club rugby in those days was captured in the poem by Jack Kelleher (right). It celebrates a 1950 St Pats match against a Petone side that featured such well-known Petone names as Hewson, Haddy, Dougan and Abbott.

The *Sports Post* reported that fullback John Gordon "made a grand save", that Ted Buddicom was prominent in some snappy back play, and that Jack Watt scored two tries.

The poem below was written by Jack Kelleher, a St Pats Town old boy who later become editor of the *Dominion*. He penned it after St Pats Old Boys beat Petone 20-5 at the Petone Rec on 31 July 1950, one week after Marist had also beaten them, 22-12 at Athletic Park.

The Rec - 20-5

Things are now doleful - in fact they are grim These footballing 'Paddys' have done it again Our blinds all in tatters, our windows all dark We've been licked again, though not at the Park

St Patricks OB, we played on our Rec And we got it once more - yes - right in the neck Last week we were humbled and sent home in shame This week we just stayed here - the result was the same

Those banshees in green and their brothers in blue Oh! Those days we will rue 'Tis lucky indeed we are still alive This time we were massacred 20 to five

In Petone, I hear, they ply a new trade
To be in you just pull your blinds down a shade
The whole town is there, our old footy club
The postie, the milkman, the bloke at the pub

You'll hear them all ask as they gather each night "Can anyone see a faint glimmer of light?"
You'll hear wistful talking of footballing finds
Alas, 'tis nought but the rustle of winds in the blinds

Then a voice quavered out – "I think I see hope Quick, fetch me a pen, I'll write to the Pope" (Those spalpeens in green, those blackguards in blue) "Your Holiness, this is now over to you.

"All Petone does beg you, yes, beg you this day To declare both these teams 'ex communé' Please split them asunder (they'll spread far and wide Then we'll grab them all to play for our side)."

A brilliant idea, the people all said We'll soon have them all in our footy shed O'Callaghan, Lyons, Doyle and Hourigan too Mullin, O'Donnell, and the rest of the Blue

Petone we'll call them, this champion team
The best in the land, a footballer's dream
But what of our own who will have to stand down?
Oh! They'll get a job pulling blinds up round town.
