### **OBITUARY**

### **Frank Ryan**

It is with sadness that the club heard of the passing of life member Frank 'Smiler' Ryan on Wednesday 18 July, a deeply respected former coach of Marist and Wellington.

Frank first came to the old Marist club in 1941 from Nihoniho in the King Country. Wearing the No 8 jersey, he played senior A (premier) rugby for Marist from 1947 to 1952, and was part of Jubilee Cup-winning teams in 1948 and 1950.

His distinguished coaching career began in 1956 when he took the reins of the senior seconds. In 1959 he took over the top side, and won Jubilee Cups in 1960 with Ivan Vodanovich as captain, and in 1962-63 with Mick Horan as captain.

Frank then moved on to repre-

sentative coaching, being sole selector/coach of the Wellington Colts from 1964-70, and the well-performed Wellington A team from 1971-74. He went on to become a North Island selector from 1979-82.

His love of the game and willingness to help out at all levels was illustrated by the fact that when he ceased his North Island selection duties, he began coaching at Holy Cross school in Miramar.

He then went on to coach at St Pats College, a role he continued well into his seventies.

A president of Marist St Pats in 1978, and of the WRFU in 1987, Frank spent most of his working life with the Dairy Board, and was their chief accountant when he retired.

The club extends its deepest sympathy to his two daughters and their families.

## Blues 22 games undefeated

MSP's under-85 Blues 7-3 win over perennial grade champions Poneke has given the team a 22-game undefeated streak, with their last loss

back on 22 July 2006.

Playing in division one, the Blues' 2007 record is played 16, won 15, and drawn 1, which comes on the back of winning their last five games of 2006.

Big wins this year have

included 45-0 over Tawa, and 46-5 over HOBM. Even when not playing well, the team has managed to scramble wins, with a last-minute 50-metre intercept by Will "Chewie" Jurie to avoid a draw with OBU a memorable case in point.

The only game in which the team was not victorious this year was the 14-all draw with defending champions Poneke. That draw also meant the team missed out by one bonus point on winning the JC Bowl for the first-round winner.

However, they made amends on 28 July when they defeated Poneke 7-3 in the second round, to inflict that team's first loss for several seasons.

Winger Miles "Bones" Tait leads the Blues try scorers with nine.
